E. P. Kaprow, Candy Company Founder, Dies

Edward P. Kaprow, 299 Essex Street, died Friday at a local hospital after a brief illness. Born in Russia, he was the founder and president of the Bangor Candy Company.

He was a member of Toldos Itzchock Synagogue, a member of the Jewish Community Center, a donor to Jewish charities, a member of the National Association of Tobacco Distributors, a member of the National Candy Wholesalers Association of the Threescore-and-Ten Club of that association.
