BANGOR – Samuel Rolsky, 92, a prominent community leader for many years, died Oct. 8, 1999, at a local hospital. He was born in Bangor, June 1, 1907, the son of Abraham and Alice (Dennis) Rolsky.

Sam was associated with the Emple Knitting Mills of Brewer for more than 50 years, where he served as president and treasurer and was affiliated with the National Knitwear Association. He was a lifetime Zionist and president of the Bangor ZOA; a member and past president of the Congregational Beth Israel, where he served in that office for three years. He was also a past president of the Brotherhood of Congregation Beth Israel; past president of the Hebrew Academy of Bangor; an active member of the B'nai B'rith Lodge; past financial officer of the Jewish Community Council; member of the Jewish Community Council and Center; participant in the United Jewish Appeal Campaign, both as a captain and worker. He was an active worker in the Jewish National Fund Campaign; a member of Congregation Beth Abraham and the YMCA.
