Malou Unobskey, 79 passed way peacefully of natural causes on December 21, 2013. She was many things in her productive life- a partner to her predeceased husband, Joe Unobskey in their fashion store in Calais, an active community member; and a dedicate mother.

In 1974 the family moved to Bangor. There, she attended the University of Maine to pursue a passion for writing. Years later, she published short stories including "Matzoh Ball Soup" for Kaboodle. In Bangor, she raised funds for many causes. She co-chaired a fashion show at St. Joseph's hospital, with former Secretary of Defense William Cohen, then a Congressman from Maine. She coordinated events for Doctors for Social Responsibility, helping them come to the University of Maine to discuss nuclear power. Writer Stephen King became involved and held an event at his home with Malou attending.

Later in life she began acting in community theater in Stratford, Connecticut, including the Baldwin Players. She also took up road racing becoming a navigator for long-time partner, George Squire. They raced from Mexico to El Salvador and took second! Malou traveled the world and everyone she met became a fast friend. Her wit, story-telling and energy made her a woman known for her "love of life"

She is survived by three children; Arthur Unobskey of Bangor; Sydney Jean Unobskey of Istanbul, turkey and Jeri Unobskey of Richmond, Virginia; a sister-in-law Martha Goldner and her husband Dr. Fred Goldner of Nashville; and a brother-in-law Sidney Unobskey and his wife Nancy of San Francisco .
