

**ROSE ROCHELLE GOLBERG****BROOKLINE, MASS. and BANGOR**

Rose Rochelle Golberg, formerly of Bangor, died July 20, 1989, at a Boston, Mass., hospital, after a long illness. She was born at Bangor, the daughter of David and Bessie (Greenberg) Golberg. Rose attended Bangor High School, and was employed for many years at the former Kray's Music Store in Boston as a clerk and pianist, and would play music for the customers. Many of the composers of that time would ask her to push their new compositions, composers like George Gershwin. She was a professional accordionist and pianist, and did accompaniment for many persons, including Percy Brand, violinist. Rose was a lifelong member of the American Federation of Musicians Local No. 9 of Boston, and a licensed real estate broker for 30-40 years. She was a member of several clubs in the Boston area and was an honorary member of the American Legion Post No. 1 of Boston. Rose was a member of Congregation Beth Israel of Bangor, of which her father, Dave Golberg, was a founding member. She attended Temple Kehilleth Israel of Brookline, Mass., and was a member of the Temple Ohabei Shalom Sisterhood in Brookline. Rose was a member and past president of the B'nai B'rith and a member of the Hadassah, both of Boston. She enjoyed performing for senior citizens groups in the Boston area until her illness in the fall of 1988. Surviving are 14 nieces and nephews, numerous grandnieces and grandnephews, and other relatives and friends. Funeral services will be held 12 noon Sunday at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, with Rabbi Joseph Schonberger and Rabbi Robert Slosberg, a grandnephew from Louisville, Ken., officiating.
