OLD TOWN and BANGOR — Alta M. Cutler, 95, wife of the late Israel R. Cutler of Old Town, died July 18, 1985, at her residence. She was born in Boston, Mass., Sept. 14, 1889, the daughter of Louis and Minnie (Myers) Goldberg. The family moved to Bangor during her childhood and she made her home in this area all of her life. Mrs. Cutler attended Bangor Schools and married Israel R. Cutler in 1909, moving to Old Town, where they owned and operated Cutler's Women's Shop for many years. She was a charter member of Temple Israel of Old Town and served as president of its Ladies Aid Committee for many years. Mrs. Cutler was active in numerous social organizations in Old Town and was a member of the Congregation Beth Israel of Bangor, the Hadassah, B'nai B'rith and the Jewish Home for the Aged. She was a charter member of the American Legion Auxiliary, Tedd-Lait Post No. 75 of Old Town, and was active at local, state and national levels, where she served as department president for the state of Maine and did volunteer work during World War II. Surviving besides her sister, Mrs. Lillian Morris of Old Town, are three nephews, Martin Burke of Portland, Aaron Burke of Lewiston and David Cutler of Bangor; one niece, Rachael Swartz of Lexington, Mass.; grandnieces, Anita and Melissa Burke of Lewiston; other grandnieces and grandnephews; two brothers-in-law, Harold Cutler of St. Louis, Mo., and Alexander Cutler of Sarasota, Fla.; a sister-in-law, Fannie Welton of Pompano Beach, Fla.
