NAPLES, FLA. — Allison Loring, 66, of Naples, Fla., and Southport, Maine, formerly of Eastport, an industrialist and philanthropist, died Dec. 12, 1985, in Florida after a long illness. He was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., Aug. 15, 1919, the son of Isadore and Rose (Goldstein) Loring. He graduated from Erasmus High School in Brooklyn in 1938 and New York University in 1942. He served in the armed forces in Natal and Brazil. He was discharged in 1946. He moved from New York to Eastport in 1947, where he became president of Argenta Products Co., president of Jacobson Inc., and vice president of Sea-Pro of Rockland. He was a trustee of Peavey Memorial Library and the Eastport Memorial Hospital. Mr. Loring was selected by Govs. Clinton Clauson and John Reed as chairman of the Washington County Recreation Authority from 1959 to 1969. He was a member and treasurer of Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club, a trustee of Summer Association of Southport and a member of Quail Creek Country Club, Naples, Fla. Surviving besides his wife, Ellen (Jacobson) Loring of Naples, Fla., and Southport are one daughter, Mrs. William (Joan) Alford of Dexter; three grandchildren. He was predeceased by a son, Roland. Funeral services will be held 11 a.m. Sunday, Dec. 15, at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, with Rabbi Raymond Krinsky of Waterville, officiating.
