

ANN UNOBSKY THEEMAN

Ann Unobsky Theeman 74, died unexpectedly on March 2, 1985 at her home in Lubec. She was born June 4, 1910 in Eastport, the daughter of Louis and Mary (Cholodny) Unobsky.

Ann was a graduate of Kent State University and taught school in both Cleveland, Ohio and Billings, Montana for several years. She was a Master Sargent in the U.S. Army during world War II. In 1946, she married the late Sidney W. Theeman and returned to Lubec where she operated the family business- Unobsky's Store and later also The Lobster Trap Gift Shop until she retired in 1978.

Ann was a prominent Washington County business woman and a "force" with which to be reckoned. She loved Lubec and Campobello and was forever grateful that the community shopped in her store and allowed her to make a living.

She was fond of saying "not everyone in Washington County can spell Theeman, but everyone can spell Unobsky".

She was a member of the Quoddy Light Chapter No 94 O.E.S. and the Republican Town Committee. She served two terms on the SAD 19 School Board and for the last twelve years of her life as a member of the Lubec Board of Selectmen. She was a member of Chaim Yosef Synagogue in Calais until its closure.

Ann is survived by her son and daughter-in law-Miles and Sharon Theeman of Bangor; a brother -Bert Unobsky of Memphis, Tennessee; two granddaughters-Meredith and Alyson Theeman, both of Bangor; & several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held at the Jewish Funeral Chapel in Bangor with Rabbi Joseph Schonberger officiating. Interment was in Beth Israel cemetery in Bangor.
