Alfred Abrahams Dies In Bangor Hospital At 78

Alfred Abrahams, 78, prominent Bangor businessman, died early Monday morning at a local hospital following a heart attack. Mr. Abrahams had been in failing health for the past few years and was stricken at his home, 106 Linden Street, and was removed to the hospital where he died shortly after arriving.

Mr. Abrahams was born in London, England, and came to the United States as a young man. He traveled extensively all over this country as a representative of picture framing and moulding concerns. In 1929 he came to Bangor and established The Picture and Gift Shop.

He was a member of the Bangor Zionist District, Pine Tree Lodge of B'nai B'rith, and the Beth Israel Synagogue. In past years he was affiliated with various business organizations.

Besides his wife, Mrs. Ann Miller Abrahams of Bangor, he is survived by three sisters: Mrs. Flora Baun of Portsmouth, England, Mrs. Lena Cohen, and Miss Minnie Abrahams, both of Croyden, England; by two brothers: John Abrahams of Portsmouth, England, and James Abrahams of London, England.

Funeral services will be held this afternoon at 1 o'clock at the Jewish Chapel on Center Street. Rabbi A. H. Freedman of the Beth Israel Synagogue will officiate.
