D. E. Rudman Of Bangor Dead At 61

David E. Rudman, 61, of 34 Bellvue Avenue, Bangor, died unexpectedly Oct. 4 at a Bangor hospital.

He was born Aug. 20, 1910 at Waterville, the son of Moses and Dora (Levine) Rudman.

He had been president of Rudman Beverage Company and the Pepsi-Cola Bottling Company, but for the past 10 years was involved in real estate investments.

Mr. Rudman attended both the University of Maine and New York University. During World War II he served in the U.S. Army with the rank of major.

He was a member of Congregation Beth Israel, B'nai Brith, and the National Jewish Welfare Board. He was a life and charter member of the Zionist Organization of America. He also was a member of Aurora Lodge of St. Louis, Scottish Rite Bodies, Maine Consistory SPRS, 32nd degree, and Anah Temple Shrine.

Mr. Rudman was also a member of the American Legion, and served on the National Council on Crime and Delinquency. He was a life member of the Boy Scouts of America; a member of Friends of Boys Clubs of America; a past president of the Pinewood Golf and Beach Club; and a member of the Greater Bangor Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Rudman is survived by his wife, Barbara (Levy) Rudman, Bangor; one son, Douglas E. Rudman; one daughter, Miss Elizabeth Rudman; two sisters, Mrs. Lillian Emple, Bangor, and Mrs. Albert (Ruth) Tobias, Margate, Fla.; and one brother, Samuel Rudman, Brewer.

Funeral services will be held at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, Wednesday at 1 p.m. with Rabbi Irving Margolies officiating.
