



JUDGE EDWARD I. GROSS
BANGOR and PALM BEACH,
FLA. - Edward I. Gross, 86, died
Feb. 18, 1999, in
Florida. He was born
Dec. 15, 1912, in
Milo, the son of Hyman and Rose
(Leavitt) Gross.



Edward was admitted to the Maine Bar in 1938. He received his education from the University of Maine and St. John's University. He was judge of the Bangor Municipal Court from 1953 to 1957. He was a member of the Governor's Judicial Council, 1954-1958; and president, Maine Association of Municipal Court Judges and Recorders, 1960. He was a member of the Bangor City Council from 1957 to 1963 and served as mayor in 1963. He was also a member of the Bangor Urban Renewal Authority, 1967-1973; and a member of the committee on Judicial Responsibility and Disability, 1978-1982. He was a member of the Penobscot County (president, 1967), Maine State and American Bar Associations. The law firm known today as Gross, Minsky, Mogul & Singal, P.A., was founded by Edward I. Gross in 1938. He entered the Army Air Corps in 1942 and was discharged as captain in 1946. He was a member of Kiwanis
