BANGOR — Mrs. Frances (Golden) Pilot, widow of Michael Pilot, a prominent Bangor attorney, died Dec. 1, 1979, at her residence following a long illness. She was born in Bangor, daughter of Rabbi Morris N. and Sarah (Meyers) Golden. She was a graduate of Bangor High School and was a legal secretary previous to her marriage to Mr. Pilot. She did volunteer work for canteen service during World War II in Bangor. She was a member of Congregation Beth Israel, a life member of the Beth Israel Sisterhood and the Hadassah, both of Bangor; a life member of the Jewish Home for Aged in Portland; a member of the B'nai B'rith and the Jewish Community Council of Bangor. She was a charter member of the Ner Israel Rabbinical College, Baltimore, Md.; a life member of the St. Joseph Hospital Auxiliary and a member of the Eastern Maine Medical Center Auxiliary.
