## Milo Clothier Harry Karp Dies At Home

MILO, May 29 — Harry Karp 63, Milo clothier for more than 40 years, died at his home early Saturday morning following a short illness.

Emigrating to this country from Poland in 1913, Karp came to Milo in 1917. His clothing store, which has been located in the Clark Building since 1922, was started after World War I following his return from the Army.

Karp was a member of the American Legion, the Lions Club, the Milo Board of Trade and Beth Israel Synagogue, Bangor.

He is survived by his widow, the former Rose Kiersh, whom he married in 1928; a son, Marvin, now an attorney in Cleveland, Ohio; a daughter, Myrna, a senior at Simmons College in Boston; a brother, Simon, associated with him in the clothing business for many years; and a sister, Gertrude Sidroney of Tel Aviv, Israel.

Funeral services will be held at the Bangor Jewish Chapel on Center Street at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon. Rabbi A. H. Freedman will officiate.

Burial will be in the Beth Israel Synagogue Cemetery.
