Henry Miller, 53, Business, Civic Leader, Is Dead

Henry Miller, 53, of 61 Garland Street died Saturday at a local hospital following a brief illness.

Born in Bangor April 25, 1915, he was the son of Max and Rebecca (Alterowich) Miller.

MILLER, Henry — died at a Bangor hospital Saturday. Friends who wish may contribute to the Henry Miller Memorial Fund in care of the Bangor YMCA.

A well-known Bangor businessman for many years, he was president of the Bangor Merchants' Bureau and was a member of the Greater Bangor Chamber of Commerce. He was associated with the Picture and Gift Shop since 1929, and in 1959 he became its president and owner. A veteran of World War II, he was the commander of the Jewish War Veterans and a member of the VFW and of the James Williams Post, American Legion.

He served as vice-president of the Maine - New Hampshire Council B'Nai B'Rith, was immediate past president of the B'Nai B'Rith Pine Tree Lodge, and served as a director of both the Beth Israel Synagogue and of the Jewish Community Council, and was a member of the Congregation Beth Israel. His interest and concern in the welfare of area children was evidenced by his serving as director of the Bangor YMCA and of the Cerebral Palsy Center.

Surviving are his wife, Adele (Stein) Miller of Bangor; one son, Mark W. Miller of Bangor; one daughter, Miss Emily Beth Miller of Bangor; four brothers, Sidney of Reading, Pa., Nathan, Abe and David, all of Bangor; one sister, Mrs. Anna P. Abrahams, Bangor; several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Sunday at 1 p. m., with Rabbi A. H. Freedman officiating. Burial was in Beth Israel Cemetery. Memorial week will be observed at the residence, 61 Garland Street.
