Harry Stern, Noted Bangor Attorney, Dies

The death of Harry Stern, 54, prominent Bangor attorney, occurred at the residence, 58 Pearl street, Tuesday morning following a long illness.

Born in Bangor, February 10, 1906, he was the son of the late Hyman and Mamie Stern. He attended local schools, and was graduated from the University of Maine where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Kappa Phi. He received his LLB degree in 1930 from the Harvard Law School where he had an outstanding scholastic record. He had practiced law in Bangor since that time, and was well known and highly respected among the legal fraternity.

Considered an authority on Maine law, Mr. Stern was co-author with the late Charles H. Bartlett of two definitive volumes, The Maine Digest. He was a member of the American Bar Association, the Maine Bar Association, the Penobscot County Bar Association, the Jewish Community Council, Zionist Organization of America, B'nai B'rith, and the Beth Israel Synagogue.

He is survived by his wife, Miriam; two daughters, Mameve and Roberta Stern; five brothers, Edward, Arthur, Samuel and Abraham Stern of Bangor, and Herbert of Portland; and a sister, Miss Edith Stern of Bangor.

Funeral services will be held at the Jewish Chapel, Center street, this afternoon at 2 o'clock. Members of the Penobscot County Bar Association have been asked by their president to attend the services in a body.
