Isadore Alpert Of Bangor Is Dead At 55

Isadore L. Alpert, 55, of 266 French Street, died in a local hospital Wednesday following a brief illness.

He was born in Bangor, May 13, 1912, the son of Israel and Bessie (Fine) Alpert. He was co-owner of Morin and Company of Bangor, Educated in the Bangor public school system, he graduated from the University of Maine in 1934. He was a member and secretary of the Beth Israel Synagogue; a

member of the board of directors of B'nai B'rith Lodge and past president of the lodge; vice president of the Maine B'nai B'rith Council; a member of the board of directors of the Jewish Community Council and a former secretary of the organization: secretary of the Zionist Organization of Bangor; a sustaining member of the Boy Scouts of America and a former Eagle Scout; a member of the Old Town Rotary Club; and a member of the brotherhood of Beth Israel Synagogue.

From 1942 to 1946 he served with the War Department as an

engineer.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Rose (Weinberg) Alpert of Bangor; three sons, Bruce D. of Columbus, Ohio, Dr. Stephen M. of Brooklyn, N.Y., and Joel E. of Bangor; three brothers, Maurice of Bangor; Dr. Sidney of Skokie, Ill., and Myer of Palos Verdes, Calif.; two sisters, Mrs. Sylvia Duze of Long Branch, N.J. and Mrs. Ada Tussing of Presque Isle.
