



JULES L. MOGUL

BANGOR — Jules L. Mogul, 64, a prominent Bangor attorney and partner in the law firm of Gross, Minsky, Mogul & Singal, P.A., died July 19, 1994, at a Bangor hospital after a brief illness. He was born in New York City, June 21, 1930, the son of Larry and Clara (Schwartz) Mogul. He was educated at New York University (AB in 1952) and Columbia University (J.D. in 1958). In 1959, he was admitted to the Maine Bar and also joined what is now Gross, Minsky, Mogul & Singal. Mr. Mogul was associate judge of Brewer Municipal Court from 1961 to 1962; compliant justice from 1962 to 1966; assistant county attorney from 1966 to 1968; member of Penobscot County Bar Association (president, 1982), Maine State and American Bar Associations; Maine Trial Lawyers Association (member, board of governors, 1972 to 1986, president, 1982 to 1984), The Association of Trial Lawyers of America and American Board of Trial Advocates (current president of the Maine Chapter). He was a U.S. Army veteran of the Korean War; a member of the Beth Israel Synagogue, B'nai B'rith; president of the Jewish Community Center; former member of the Bangor

Jaycees; a board member of the Bangor Area Visiting Nurses, Inc.; and member of the Penobscot Valley Country Club, the Wycliffe Country Club of Lake Worth, Fla., the Bangor Tennis & Recreation Club, Rising Virtue Lodge No. 10 AF & AM of Bangor, Scottish Rite Bodies Valley of Bangor, and Anah Temple Shrine. Surviving, in addition to his wife, Roberta Mogul, are a son and daughter-in-law, Steven J. and Darlene E. Mogul; a granddaughter, Taylor Brooke Mogul, all of Bangor; a daughter and son-in-law, Carolyn and David B. Morganstern; granddaughters, Cayla Ann Morganstern and Daria Gail Morganstern, all of East Northport, N.Y.; a sister and brother-in-law, Rae and Edward I. Gross of Bangor; niece, Carol Weix of Coral Springs, Fla.; a sister and brother-in-law, Gloria and The Honorable Herbert Susser of Patterson, N.J.; nephews, Jack Susser of Fair Lawn, N.J., Allen Susser of Wayne, N.J.; brother-in-law, Richard Gover of Hauppauge, N.Y.; nephew, James Gover of Floral Park, N.Y.; nieces, Joanne Gover and Tzivia Gover, both of New York City; and mother-in-law, Gertrude Gover of Bangor.
