Julius Stone, Business Firm Founder, Dies

Julius Stone, 57, of 185 Norfolk Street, Bangor, president and founder of the Standard Electric Company, died Tuesday evening at a Bangor hospital following a brief illness.

He was a life-long resident of Bangor. The son of the late Fannie and Isaac Stone, he was educated at Bangor High School and the University of Maine. Prior to the founding of the Standard Electric Company he was assistant manager of the Bangor District of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, a position he held for 16 years.

He was active in the social and civic organizations in the Bangor area. He was a supporter of various charitable and philanthropic groups for many years including the Bangor-Brewer United Fund.

He was a member of the Bangor-Brewer Lions Club, Pine Tree Lodge of B'nai B'rith, the Jewish Community Center where he served as a member of the finance committee, the Bangor Zionist organization, and the Beth Israel Synagogue.

He was also a former director of Bangor Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Kenduskeag Plaza Parking Committee, and of the Hebrew School Building Committee.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Helen Goldsmith Stone, formerly of Old Town; by a daughter, Brenda, and a son, Richard, all of Bangor; by a sister, Mrs. Rose Gladstone of Merrick, Long Island, N. Y.; by two brothers, Morris Stone of Oakland, Calif., and Paul Stone of Pittsburgh, Pa. Several nieces and nephews also survive.

Funeral services will be held this morning at 11 o'clock at the Jewish Chapel on Center Street. Rabbi A. H. Freedman will officiate.

Interment will be in the Beth Israel Cemetery.
