

LEWIS PLESSET

BANGOR — Lewis Plesset, 66, of Bangor, died March 3, 1988, at a local hospital. He was born in Fort Kent, Aug. 15, 1921, the son of Leo and Ida (Etscovitz) Plesset. He served as a sergeant during World War II in the Air Corps as a photographer in the South Pacific. He was a member of the Congregation Beth Israel and a former member of the B'nai B'rith. Lewis was a well-known Bangor grocer and former owner of Plesset's Superette. Surviving besides his wife, Ida (Sclair) Plesset of Bangor, are one daughter and son-in-law, Gail E. and Dr. George D. Baquis of Nashua, N.H.; one son, Robert J. Plesset of Princeton, N.J.; two sisters, Pearl E.
