BANGOR — Marion G. Laeger, 62, died July 28, 1988, at a Bangor hospital. She was born April 23, 1926, in New York City, N.Y., the daughter of Alexander and Nettie (Lefcourt) Goldberg. She was a 1945 cum laude graduate of Hunter College, where she was elected to the honorary science society, Phi Sigma. Among her many interests, she had a great love for the outdoors and was an avid skier and tennis player.
