Brewer man dies in Hawaii

Maxwell Rapaport, 61, of Brewer, veteran life insurance man, died suddenly September 2 in Honolulu, Hawaii, where he was attending the conference of the Equitable Life Insurance Company's President's Council.

He represented Equitable for 35 years in Maine and was named to their Hall of Fame besides earning many other honors in the insurance field.

Born in Caribou, he was a member of the Class of 1935 at the University of Maine. He was very active in all community affairs in Bangor and Brewer where he was past president of the Pine Tree Chapter of B'nai B'rith. He was a member of the St. Joseph Hospital Advisory Board and was serving as secretary at the time of his death.
