



MAX S. KOMINSKY
BANGOR — Max S. Kominsky, 93, of 33 D Longrale Park, Bangor, died Oct. 27, 1984, at his winter residence in St. Petersburg Beach, Fla. He was born on July 15, 1891, in Bangor, the son of Simon and Sarah (Cohen) Kominsky. Mr. Kominsky was the owner of the former Brass Rail Restaurant on Exchange Street, Bangor, retiring in 1945, and later sold life insurance for North Western Mutual Life Insurance Co. He was a member of the Bangor Kiwanis Club and the first recipient of the Man of the Year Award, given by the Kiwanis. Mr. Kominsky was a past president of Congregation Beth Israel and the Jewish Community Council. He was head of the Israeli Bond Drive and the United Jewish Appeal. He was actively involved in manifold fund raising drives including United Fund, Red Cross, Maine Heart Association, Urban Renewal,

Bangor Band, Bangor Theological Seminary and Husson College, whose officials named the Kominsky Auditorium in his honor. He was married to the late Minnie (Ginsberg) Kominsky for 68 years. Surviving are a grandson, Norman S. Kominsky of Bangor; a granddaughter, Mrs. Sherman (Barbara) Burry of Denver, Colo.; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Howard L. Kominsky of Bangor; four great-grandchildren, Julie and Andrew Kominsky, both of Bangor, Melissa and Michelle Burry, both of Denver, Colo.; several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by a son, Dr. Howard L. Kominsky. Funeral services will be held 12 noon Monday at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, with Rabbi Joseph P. Schonberger officiating.
