



SAMUEL ROSEN, D.M.D.

BANGOR — Samuel Rosen, D.M.D., 95, of Norway Road, a well-known dentist in Bangor for 60 years, died Nov. 3, 1993, at a local hospital. He was born in Bangor, June 22, 1898, the son of Elias Haskell and Lena Rachael (Emple) Rosen. He was a graduate of the Bangor public schools and Tufts Dental School, Boston, Class of 1922. Dr. Rosen always maintained a high interest in his profession, as well as enjoying photography and portrait painting. Dr. Rosen will be remembered not only for the warm and caring individual he was, but also for his generosity to health care causes. At St. Joseph Hospital, the memory of Samuel and his wife, Doris, lives on in the Samuel and Doris Rosen Critical Care Unit. This seven bed unit, dedicated in September 1981 was the first major addition to the hospital since the present hospital building was built in 1964. Dr. Rosen also contributed generously to the cardio-radiology section at Eastern Maine Medical Center. Surviving are two brothers, Benjamin D. Rosen of Houston, Texas, Abraham E. Rosen, M.D., of Worcester, Mass.; nieces, nephews and cousins. He was predeceased by two brothers, William H. Rosen and Edward E. Rosen; and a sister, Esther (Rosen) Aisner. Funeral services will be held 11:45 a.m. Sunday at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, with Rabbi Joseph Schonberger officiating. Interment will be in Beth Israel Cemetery.
