## SIDNEY WILLIAM THEEMAN

Sidney W. Theeman, a resident of Lubec since the end of WW II, died at the age of 49 on Sunday, July 14, 1968 at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital after a long illness. A native of Yonkers, New York he was the youngest of four children of Adolph and Rose Mauskopf Theeman. He was a graduate of Yonkers High School and a charter member of the Maccabee Community Center.

After high school, he worked as a dress cutter in the ladies garment industry in NYC and then joined the Army where he was a SSgt in the 113<sup>th</sup> Medical Corp. During his enlistment, he met MSgt Anne Unobsky and they married on December 29<sup>th</sup> 1945. Thereafter, they returned to Anne's hometown of Lubec where they operated Unobsky's, a mercantile that served Lubec, Campobello and eastern Washington County families.

In Lubec, he was a member of the American Legion, a commander of the VFW, a member and President of the Lubec Lion's Club, a 32<sup>nd</sup> degree mason in the AM & FM lodge of Anah Temple, Chairman of the Lubec Planning Committee and member of the Lubec basketball town team. He was also a member of Congregation Chaim Joseph in Calais.

A city boy at birth, he adored the small town life of Lubec and the family camp on Indian Lake in Whiting. A gentle soul, he was devoted to his family and his community.

In addition to his loving wife, he leaves behind a son Miles, two sisters, Mrs Max (Frieda) Fried and Mrs. Philip (Helen) Schwartz both of Yonkers. His brother Alex, died previously.
