

WILLIAM MOSES SHUBERT, M.D.
BANGOR — William M. Shubert,
78, died Nov. 26, 1994, after a long
illness. He was born May
10, 1916, in Boston, Mass.,
the son of Rose and Julius
Shubert, M.D. He was a graduate of

the University of Iowa, Class of 1937, and Tufts College Medical School, Class of 1941. He interned at New Britain General Hospital, Conn., from 1941-1942. Dr. Shubert was a lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Army-Air Force from 1942-1946, serving as flight surgeon with the headquarters of the 99th Bomb Group. After World War II, Dr. Shubert was in general practice in Bangor until 1950. He spent 1950-1953 at Cambridge City Hospital, Cambridge, Mass. as a resident in obstetrics and gynecology, and became a certified member of the American Board of Obstetrics-Gynecology. He was a fellow of the American College of Surgeons and the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, of which he was Maine Section Chairman from 1959-1962. In 1968, Dr. Shubert distinguished himself by becoming one of the few obstetricians to become certified by the American Society of Cytology. He was a member of the Maine Medical Association, the American Medical Association, and was a past president of the Maine Society of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Dr. Shubert served as Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology at St. Joseph Hospital and Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Eastern Maine Medical Center from 1962-1980. In addition, Dr. Shubert served as a consultant to numerous area hospitals. During his long professional career, Dr. Shubert made many contributions to medicine. He natented a gynecological instru-

Amongst his many civic contributions were his chairmanship of the Save The Morse Covered Bridge Committee, his membership in St. Andrews Lodge No. 10 AF & AM. and his membership in the VFW. Dr. Shubert served on the Bangor City Council from 1986-1989 and from 1992 to the present. In 1986, he received a blue ribbon in the "Beat the Squaw Mountain Man" ski race. Surviving in addition to his wife, Jane (Dunning) "Sandy" Shubert of Bangor are eight children, William M. Shubert Jr. and his wife, Carol, of Cherry Hill, N.J., Jordan J. Shubert, M.D., and his wife, Phyllis, of Bangor, Susan A. Buchwald, M.D., and her husband, Theodore, of Reno, Nev., Dennis L. Shubert, M.D., and his wife, Jane, of Bangor, Robert K. Shubert of Brewer, Alice S. Adams and her husband, Vernard, of Tampa, Fla., Elizabeth V. Willette and her husband, Harold, of Seal Harbor, Jayson J. Shubert of Bangor. He was predeceased by a daughter, Sally M. Shubert. Also surviving are four stepchildren, Jane W. Garland of Hancock, Jonni-Anne Carlisle and her husband, Colin, of Holden, Joseph A. Garland of Dedham, James D. Garland of Bangor; 18 grandchildren, William M. III, Virginia and Alyson Shubert, Jennifer, Sarah, Daniel and Emily Shubert, Dana Buchwald, Kenyon, D. Zachary, Brooke and Christopher Shubert, Robert K. Shubert Jr., Charles, Meagan and Leslie Adams, Tiffany and Adam Carlisle. He was predeceased by a grandson, Scott Buchwald. In addition, he is survived by one sister-in-law, Rose Shubert of Brookline, Mass. He was predeceased by a brother, Lester H. Shubert of Massachusetts. A funeral service will be held 1 p.m. Monday at the Jewish Funeral Chapel, Center Street, Bangor, with Rabbi Joseph Schonberger officiating. Interment will be in the Beth Israel Cemetery.
